The general public will not automatically realize that even with a central HEPA filter, a respiratory droplet needs to get to the filter for it to work. An HVAC system can’t protect against people coughing directly on each other.

We are kicking off the year in government advocacy picking up where we left off last year. If you will recall, the NEOK and Central OK chapters worked together to get legislation sponsored to add requirements to the OUBCC that at least one member be a licensed engineer to properly represent our industry’s interests. That legislation didn’t make it out of committee, but we are again working with legislators to get new legislation sponsored in the upcoming legislation session. Additionally, we are continuing our efforts to get the IECC portion of the International Code Council included with the adoption of the other code sections currently adopted by the state. This will insure that most consistent code requirements as all of the sections will be based on the same year of adoption.

We are also turning our sights toward providing assistance and guidance to local municipal governments as well as public school boards regarding some of the information ASHRAE’s Epidemic Task Force has issued regarding reopening and maintaining healthy buildings. This will likely take place both in person as well as virtually. HISTORY

Thought I would try a different approach to history this month and hope to get some interest from others about the subject of HVAC that we have spent many years of our life in.

I have approximately 58 years in this industry and notice most of the people I have met got into HVAC through some kind of help from parents, etc. I did not have anyone to guide me and it seems my introduction into this industry was kind of by chance. I took architectural drafting in high school with the hope of working in that field after graduation, but with no chance of college I joined the Army. During my time in Germany I became acquainted with someone who recognized my high school senior ring from Central. We became friends and I when I was due to be discharged I told him I would drop by his house to meet his parents when I returned to the states. This is when I met Bill Short PE, an electrical engineer sharing an office with Jack Tumilty (Collins Engineering Co.). He said Jack was looking for some help so I stopped in and met Jack and showed him some drawings I did in high school and was hired on the spot.

It did not take long for me to get hooked on the HVAC side of this business. Remember I was in school without air conditioning and we had a swamp cooler at home. Air conditioning was a word I knew nothing about. All I knew was it was cool in movie theatres and some restaurants, but had no idea how it worked.

Bill Collins provided in house training for me and a couple of individuals in the OKC office for several years and we had homework and our papers were graded. After that I was able to attend many other training programs put on by Trane and Carrier over the next several years. The more I learned about HVAC the more I was hooked on how everything comes together. Jack Tumilty PE and Tom Owens PE sponsored me so I could get certified as an Engineer Technician. I was able to go to school on the GI Bill and received an Associate Degree in Business in 1975.

One way I have always looked at our industry is the architects design the facility but what we do is make the building work. Without HVAC, Plumbing and Electrical you have a nice facility but that's all. When you look back over the past 50-plus years since our industry has advanced, buildings have become much more than just another building. Our industry has provided them with a brain in some ways.

When you think about it, we do a lot of work between when a building is designed and when the occupants can walk into a facility and have all the necessary things in their right places, installed by so many different people working on their part of the project. sometimes think the general public has no appreciation on what it takes to put these facilities together and what is behind the

walls or above the ceilings to make their lives comfortable. To this day, I think I have been lucky to have spent my entire career in one industry, and I have enjoyed every minute of it. I would like to hear from others about how they came into this industry. I still find it a very challenging industry with new things all the time. We need to continue to find ways of getting young engineers to get on board and get hooked as I did.

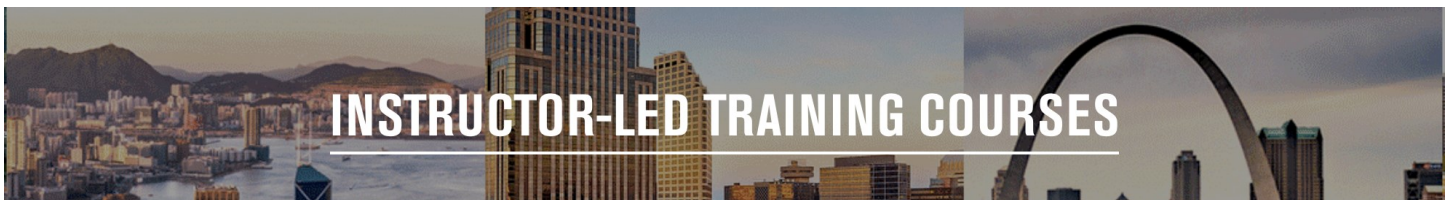

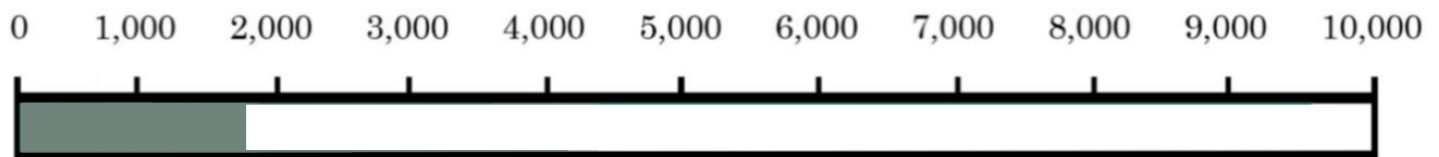
