HISTORY By Gene Redford

Since I have not heard back from anyone yet about their history, I will start off in hopes it will inspire some response from some of you to give me some articles to share.

My dad was a truck driver and we were involved in laying the oil pipelines across AZ, NM, and TX in the early 40's, moving about every six weeks. I was born in Kentucky and by the time I was 8 years old we had lived in 7 or 8 states. Around 1948 we settled in Tulsa when my dad went from hauling pipe to hauling oil field equipment out of Tulsa with Parkhill Trucking.



I remember wanting to be an Architect as I liked to draw as far back as the sixth grade. One of my projects in the 9th grade wood shop class was to design something to build. I designed a desk for me to use at home and still have that same desk today. I took architectural drafting while in high school, not knowing of my future at that time.

I worked at Oertle's during high school, so after graduating from high school and no job opportunities at that time and no chance at college I joined the Army in September 1959. I was involved in a plane crash on the way to Fort Dix. I was assigned to 35th Armor Bn. in Mannheim Germany, serving as operation assistant in S-3. The barracks we stayed in were old Germany Army buildings with steam radiators. At that I knew nothing about heating or air conditioning. All I remember was we had a floor furnace at home and while in AZ, we had a devise in our car window to keep us cool.

When I returned to Tulsa in Sept. 1962, I stopped in to meet a family of a friend I met in Germany from Tulsa, and they introduced me to their neighbor who shared an office with Jack Tumilty. After hearing of my desires of wanting to be an Architect, he suggested I visit with Jack. I showed Jack my work from high school, and he hired me to come to work for him, which was Collins Engineering Company out of OKC. Collins had an in house program for employees to learn about the HVAC industry, and was graded by one of their engineers in OKC. I would receive classroom questions to answer for homework and send back to OKC for grading. I was fortunate to work for two highly respected ASHRAE members, Bill Collins was a past president of ASHRAE, and Jack Tumilty chaired the committee for ASHRAE,

who redesigned the Mechanical code which became BOCA. In 1969 Jack suggested I get Certified as an Engineering Tech which I did using Jack and Tom Owens as my two PE sponsors.

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) has released RES*check* Version 2.1.0, a free, web-based software application that helps builders, designers, and contractors demonstrate that a particular home complies with the latest provisions of the International Energy Conservation Code, the 2021 IECC. DOE has determined that the provisions of the 2021 IECC will achieve savings of 9.4% in residential buildings (compared to the previous 2018 edition).


