Thank you to everyone who was able to attend our March meeting! Our speaker for last month's meeting was Garen Ewbank. Mr. Ewbank presented on the stages of development for geothermal heat pumps. I'd like to thank Mr. Ewbank for being more than willing to present at our chapter's meeting.

Our April meeting's presentation will be by Richard Anderson. Mr. Anderson will be speaking over the fundamentals of steam. Richard has 25 years of experience working on sizing, running selections, creating specifications for industrial steam systems and products, heat transfer equipment, condensate removal devices, pressure reduction, condensate pumps, and boiler trim pumps. He's also a member of the Fluid Controls Institute: an ANSI accredited standards developer for steam traps, pipeline strainers, control valves, solenoid valves, regulators, secondary pressure drainers, and sanitary equipment. 
