## **HISTORY**

This month I thought it would be a good time to remember someone who I had the pleasure of knowing and working for and was a distinguished member of ASHRAE, William J. Collins, Jr. P. E. Even though Bill Collins was not a member of our chapter, he did play a major roll in how our chapter succeeded through out all of these years.

Some of the older members of our chapter will remember Bill very well while the younger members need to know a little history on how Bill Collins played a major roll in ASHRAE.

Bill Collins was a professional Engineer in Oklahoma City where he founded Collins Engineering Associates in 1946. Another bit of history for those who don't remember, Jack Tumilty managed the Tulsa office of Collins Engineering and I got my start in this industry working for Jack.

Bill Collins was a Fellow/Life member of the Central Oklahoma Chapter, and has been given credit for several achievements along the way. One of the most notable was developing the financial support of ASHRAE research program. For his effort ASHRAE established the William J. Collins Jr. Research Promotion Award in 1985.

Bill Collins served as Society President in 1975 – 76, with a theme of commitment. "Only by committing ourselves can we accomplish a job well done. Ingenuity, pride and hard work are the real answers to the problems of today's energy conscious world... for not only do we have challenges----we have opportunities."

In 1998, Bill received the Society's highest honor, the F. Paul Anderson Award, which recognizes "notable achievement, outstanding work or service in any field of the Society."


Another achievement Bill was involved in was assisting in establishing the Presidential Award of Excellence, which was in 1970, which was based on the Region VIII Golden Gavel Award created by Bill and others and the Society's regional structure.

Since 1950 Bill actively served in more than 40 positions at the local, regional, national and international levels of ASHRAE.

In 1981, Bill was elected to the Oklahoma State University Engineering Hall of Fame. He was awarded an ASHRAE Distinguished Service Award in 1965, elevated to the grade of Fellow ASHRAE in 1966, received the Andrew T. Boggs Service Award for distinguished service to ASHRAE in 1993 and the Distinguished 50 – Year Member Award in 1999. Bill retired as chief executive officer of Collins Engineering in 1991.

Our chapter was fortunate to have him so close to our chapter in many ways, through business and ASHRAE. We always had the challenges with his chapter, which made us a strong chapter, as we always had the desires to succeed in both chapters. I think this is why the two Oklahoma chapters of ASHRAE are always at the top of the list. In turn I believe in over the last 20 or so years this has brought some of the other chapters in region VIII up to the challenge, making our region one of the strongest regions in ASHRAE.


#### President: Keith Averitt

#### General Budget Review: All Parties

Budget Discussion

- Treasurer brought copies of the previous budget to the meeting to review as an example.
- Treasurer is currently working with an accountant on Audit of the previous year's budget.
- Line Item 207 will increase to \$800 from \$300 to include the funds for storing the NEOK ASHRAE historical items.
- Line Item 203 will take the remainder (\$515)
- Line Item 221 will increase to \$600 from \$100 to include the funds for monthly book-keeping as performed by an accountant, based on an estimated cost of \$35-\$50 monthly.
- Line Item 209 to be adjusted to reflect \$30 per meal, 31.5 meals per meal, for a total of 7 meetings per ASHRAE year, for the year of 2022-2023.
- Line Item 218 will increase from \$1000 to \$1500 in order to provide more funding for Student Activities.
- Line Item 219 will increase to \$800 from \$500.
- Line Item 220 will increase to \$2000 from \$1600


