




YEA

I remember our chapter decided to change the editor for the Oil Capital Aire and assign that duty to the Vice President, each year. This has been working fine, as we have one of the best newsletters in our region. Each chapter is graded on different committees, such as membership research, student activities, etc. I'm sure most of you have heard about the PAOE points, which stands for Presidents Award of Excellence. Our chapter is one of two chapters in our region to continually score in all committees every year. In 1999-00 year, our chapter was the only chapter in ASHRAE to achieve the maximum allowed points in all committees.

The following chapter presidents have received the Golden Gavel Award for his year as chapter president.

Mary Bowers came really close to receiving the Golden Gavel award in her year of 1997-98, but that was the year we hosted the CRC. Story is that it is unusual to win this award the year your chapter host CRC, but we were just fractions of points from winning anyway.

Like I said our chapter hosted the CRC in 197-98 at the Doubletree Warren Place. Jack Tumilty and Chick Morse chaired this committee and to date I think it is still one of the best if not the best CRC meeting held in Region VIII. As I remember the rest of the chapters in our region did every-thing, they could to top it. This was also the year the Candlewood Club closed down and the chapter moved to the Sheraton Hotel on 41st Street.

The year I was president will be a year to remember as we started off the year with Rob Sullivent, our incoming president getting transferred to Texas. I took over as president and about four weeks later my treasurer (Charles Brunner) was transferred out of state. If you are counting, we just lost half of the officers. So, we had some good brainstorm meetings and came up with some replacements and finished out the year and still was able to come up with the Golden Gavel Award that year, boy was I surprised. This is why we have one of the best chapters in ASHRAE, because we have great teamwork and members.

Keith Browne jumped right in the next year and won the Golden Gavel again. Jack Tumilty was awarded the Distinguished 50-year Member Award that same year at the annual meeting in Seat-tle.




